Friday, 21st May

6:00 – 8:00 pm. Lecture: The Inner Worlds of Gaia

The Earth is a gigantic consciousness called Gaia. Which are the inner dimensions of Earth and how do they find their expression on the Earth's surface? Pogačnik shares his experiences of parallel worlds that are of basic importance to the life of Earth. Mythology calls these "fairy worlds" – but the question is what their practical function is in life? How can we cooperate with the Gaia consciousness to solve our ecological problems?

9:30 am – 5:00 pm. Workshop: Budapest as the Meeting Point of Cosmic Dimensions

A city like Budapest is not only a complex urban structure but also a place of interaction between human culture and the invisible worlds of life forces and Gaia consciousness. During the workshop we investigate the places in Budapest where this interaction takes place and what their purpose is. Are they in good condition? Do they need our help to expand their activity? How can we experience them? These are some of the fundamental questions that should be answered during the workshop.
